#### Shadows-on-the-Teche

Located on the banks of the Bayou Teche, this 1834 manor house was built by sugar cane planter David Weeks. Enjoy the same lush gardens and subtle beauty of this historic home that welcomed the likes of Walt Disney and Henry Miller, First restored in the 1930s, the Shadows has revived the tradition of true Southern hospitality. Owned by the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

## McIlhenny Co.
